



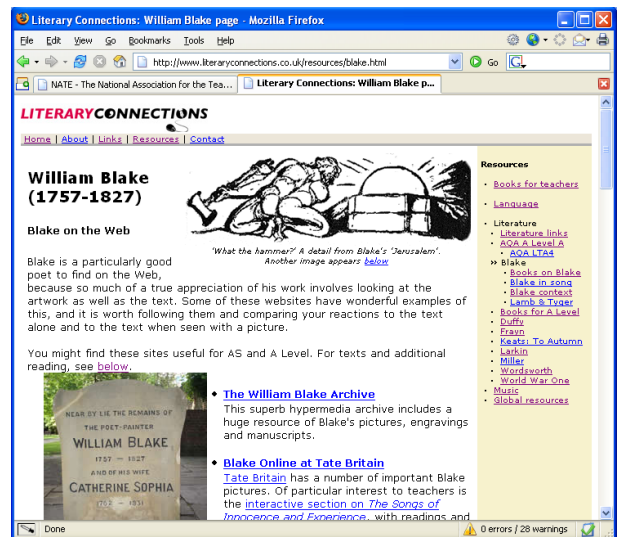
Resources for literature teachers (and others)
